SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP CODE OF ETHICS

1. PURPOSE

This procedure is to ensure that the M.A.A.A. Special Interest Groups conform to an acceptable Code of Ethics in their participation of the sport of Model Aviation.

3. APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

The M.A.A.A. Statement of Rules, M.A.A.A. By-Laws, the M.A.A.A. Rules Books and the M.A.A.A. Manual of Procedures.

4. CODE OF ETHICS

- (a) All members of a SIG shall conform to the M.A.A.A. Code of Ethics.
- (b) All activities conducted by the SIG should be aimed at promoting the sport of model aviation both for the specific discipline and in general.
- (c) Neither the SIG nor its members shall do anything to bring the sport of model aviation into disrepute.
- (d) The SIG shall conduct itself at all times in a manner that is consistent with the aims and objectives of the M.A.A.A.
- (e) Membership of the SIG will be open to any Affiliate Members of the M.A.A.A. and from any State. All members will be treated equally and consistently.
- (f) Any events organised by the SIG on behalf of the M.A.A.A. will be open to all M.A.A.A. Affiliate Members whether or not members of the SIG.
- (g) The SIG will use its best endeavours to ensure its members treat each other with mutual respect, and support each other to develop both individual and collective skills.
- (h) Debates on issues concerning the SIG and its members shall be conducted in a positive manner without personal or insulting comments being made particularly in a public media or forum.
